



FIFTH SOUTHERN'S PAST CAPTAINS ASSOCIATION KRILL TRAINING AID AWARD



There shall be an award known as the Krill Training Aid Award. Said award shall be presented annually at a District Conference to the member who submits the single best of show Coast Guard Auxiliary Training Aid for consideration. The judging of this award shall be made from among all entries properly submitted and displayed at a District Conference selected by the DCO. Said award, including engraving shall cost not more than seventy-five dollars, to be paid from the Krill Endowment Fund.

The Krill Training Aid Award, hereinafter Krill Award, was conceived by the member whose name it bears (George O. Krill, DCO 1968 – 1969), as a means of stimulating greater development and widespread use of training aids in Auxiliary Public Education and Member Training programs. Accordingly, the award must be suitable for classroom use. Said award will be judged as best among all aid entered in the following four categories:

CATEGORIES

- MEMBER TRAINING; all sessions such as BQ, VSC, PV, Instructor, Operations, ATON, Specialty Courses and general training.
- PUBLIC EDUCATION CLASSES; all subjects.
- AUDIO/VISUAL AIDS; such as Power Point, Animations, and Unique Computer Presentations.
- ADMINISTRATION AND GENERAL; Aids that do not fall into the above categories.

CRITERIA

To be considered for the Krill Award an aid must meet the following:

- Be suitable for instruction in some phase of one or more of the subjects listed in the above categories.
- Be accompanied by plans, simple and detailed, or with photographs sufficient to enable its reproduction by amateur craftsmen.
- Be accompanied by instructions for its operation and/or use by another Auxiliarist instructor not having special skills or knowledge of its construction techniques.
- Not cost more than fifty dollars for materials.
- Be accompanied by a material list of all items necessary for its construction.
- Be portable and have suitable protective wrappings.
- Not be commercially manufactured or developed.
- Not be resubmitted for further consideration on the District level, if chosen for the Krill Award.
- All accompanying documents must be no greater than 8 x 11 inches in size to facilitate reproduction for distribution and publication.
- The registration form must be signed by the member submitting the training aid, thereby giving the PCA permission to distribute and/or publish the application and all accompanying data, drawings and other pertinent information as it sees appropriate.

POINT EVALUATION AND SCORING

(From 0 – 10 points for each item will be awarded)

- Portability
- Simplicity of Design
- Effectiveness in conveying basic ideas for which intended
- Cost (low cost usually encourages reproduction)
- Appearance and quality of workmanship
- General applicability at all levels of Auxiliary instruction
